### **FREE SUMMER FUN FOR FAMILIES**

*The Summer Reading Challenge for children starts in all Kent's libraries on Saturday 15 July. The Challenge encourages children aged 4 – 11 to read 6 books during the long summer break. Children collect rewards along the way for reading whichever library books they choose. When they read 6 books they will receive a fantastic medal and certificate. This year's theme, *Animal Agents*, features a variety of clever creatures, specially trained to use their skills and natural instincts to solve mysteries. It is a great opportunity to have fun over the summer holidays.*

*Children can find competitions, challenges, author interviews, news and the Book Sorter which recommends what children might like to read next on the Summer Reading Challenge website throughout the year.*

Raise awareness of dementia with titles such as *Grandma's box of memories: helping Grandma to remember* by Jean Demetris and *Really and truly: a story about dementia* by Emilie Rivard, available from Kent Libraries.

### **Deaf Awareness Week 15<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> May 2017**

Raise awareness of deafness by learning sign language. Explore relevant titles such as *What the jackdaw saw* written by deaf children with Julia Donaldson, *Dachy's deaf* by Jack Hughes and *Moonbird* by Joyce Dunbar and Jane Ray, available from Kent Libraries.

### **Elmer Day Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> May 2017**

Encourage pupils to celebrate Elmer Day by visiting their local library to borrow Elmer books written by David McKee. Perhaps you'd like to borrow an Elmer title that

There are a variety of items to borrow from the library. There is fiction of varying levels including beginner readers and picture books, and non-fiction on many different subjects. These are available in different formats that include large print, audio CD and dual-language picture books. We also have storybags available to borrow which is a great resource for storytime and Bag Books for multi-sensory storytelling.

There are public PCs available to use and children get 5 free prints for homework every day. We have a range of online resources including Britannica Online, Britannica Spotlight Series, Issues, EBSCO and Grzimek's Animal Encyclopaedia.
